In lieu of the experience and training requirements listed above, the CESD Board of Directors may consider candidates who meet transitional administrator or exceptional administrator license requirements.








# About Clackamas ESD

# \$74.6 million Total Budget

- 44% State School Fund (\$33.1 million)
- 56% Competitive state and federal grants, contracts and other fee-forservice initiatives (\$41.5 million)



We also sponsor a yearly **regional art show**, which showcases the talents of middle and high school students throughout Clackamas County, including those to whom we provide special education services.

### 2020 impact examples

- \$25 million in state and federal grants leveraged to provide support to our partner districts and families in our communities
- \$11 million+ in revenues sent directly to districts to use on ESD services of their choice
- \$10 million+ in core service support to districts in special education, teaching and learning, and technology
- More than 4,600 youth served directly and through district partnerships in special education, early learning, career technical education and migrant/ bilingual education programs
