- Application to TSPC, the licensing agency (Teacher Standards and Practices Commission)

- Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT-CBEE)
- Bachelor of Science in Clinically Based Elementary Education (BS-CBEE)





OSU's Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT-CBEE)

At Oregon State University we offer an innovative residency-model for teacher education through our clinically-based Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT This hybrid-online program offers a clinical model, meaning we offer rich and meaningful apprenticeship experiences throughout the program with highly-skilled practitioners. The program is full time, 51 credits over two years where students are in classrooms from the start of the school year until graduation.

The OSU MAT Clackamas Partnership is meant for instructional staff interested in teaching, and focuses in particular on finding and nurturing aspiring teachers who reflect the racial, ethnic, linguistic, and cultural diversity of Clackamas elementary schools, and who are interested in transformative and equity work. We provide supports that assist non-traditional graduate students, including both career-changers and first-generation college students.

2+2: Community College Pathway with OSU's Bachelor of Science in Clinically Based Elementary Education (BS-CBEE)

The Community College pathway and OSU's Bachelor of Science in Clinically Based Elementary Education(BS-CBEE) option provide a professional 180-credit program that builds on a two-year community college degree (AAOT/Elem ED or 90 pre-approved credits). The BS-CBEE option features culturally responsive pedagogy, teaching for equity and inclusion, and science and math topics leading to an Oregon preliminary teaching license in Elementary-Multiple Subjects. As part of their degree program, students will also complete coursework to obtain an ESOL endorsement with their license.

This option takes advantage of partnerships between school districts, community colleges and OSU's College of Education to provide teacher candidates with in-depth experiences in district classrooms. OSU courses are offered fully online and hybrid (a combination of online and face-to-face learning).
